Re: 2024 Election Voter Information Resources/Guidelines for Parishes

Introduction

On Tuesday, November 5, 2024 general elections will take place with various federal, state, and local offices on the ballot. This year features a presidential election, which typically leads to increased voter turnout and attention to faithful citizenship.

It is important to note that the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, inclusive of its related entities, neither endorses nor opposes any candidate for political office. Rather it seeks to assist Catholics as they prepare to vote with well-formed consciences.

Informational Resource Materials for Use in Parishes

The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference has produced a Presidential Candidate Comparison document and a document illustrating the stances of candidates for office at the state level in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. They seek to educate the faithful about candidates and their positions on issues of importance to Catholic voters.

Those resource documents are attached to this email and will be posted to <u>archphila.org</u> and <u>CatholicPhilly.com</u>, the official website and the official digital news agency of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, respectively.

In addition, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is once again offering *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*. This teaching document focused on civic responsibility in the political arena is available in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>, with an updated Introductory Note (English and Spanish).

Requests from Third Parties to Distribute Election Materials or to Utilize Parish Facilities

In the coming weeks, you may receive requests from various organizations to disseminate election-based materials on parish property. Only materials emanating from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, the PCC, or the USCCB are sanctioned for distribution.

In a like manner, you may receive requests from groups or candidates to hold gatherings related to the election. As a general rule, no such gatherings should take place within a 60 day window of an election.
